Cambodian applicants are advised to check with the respective national Contact Point the eligibility as to who may apply and what costs are eligible before a consortium submits the complete application.

Eligibility

Research Proposals may be submitted by Cambodian (based in Cambodia) coming from:

- Public legal Research and Development entities
- Higher education institutions
- Non-university research establishments

Funding modalities

The funding is limited to:

Mobility:

1 – For Cambodian scientists:

To Europe:

- o Flights at economy class
- o Visa and insurance
- o Transfer to and from airport
- o Living expenses based on the amount of €120 per day (covering accommodation and subsistence)
- o Travel costs within the country

To another Southeast Asian country:

- o Flights at economy class
- o Visa and insurance
- o Transfer to and from airport
- o Living expenses based on the amount of €110 per day (covering accommodation and subsistence)
- o Travel costs within the country

Within Cambodia:

- o Travel costs reimbursed at actual cost
- o Accommodation and subsistence at a daily rate of €100

Workshops and events in Cambodia:

Necessary costs directly related to the preparation and implementation of workshops are eligible, including:

- o venue hire, meals and refreshments
- o equipment hire
- o stationary and materials
- o printing and dissemination of workshop reports
- o costs of invited international experts, consisting of economy class flights, visa, transfer to and from airport, and daily living expenses of €100.

Equipment:

Small equipment costs can be covered if directly required for the project and the need is clearly demonstrated.

Consumables:

Consumables can be covered if directly required for the project and the need is clearly demonstrated.

Personnel costs:

Personnel costs at a maximum of 10 % of the total cost are eligible ONLY for proposals submitted by Higher Education Institutions. These costs are to cover incentives for researchers, research assistants, and administrative staff involved and need to be justified clearly in the proposal.

Subcontracting costs:

Subcontracting costs are not eligible.

Indirect costs and management costs:

Indirect costs and management costs at a maximum of 5 % of the total cost are eligible ONLY for proposals submitted by Higher Education Institutions. These costs are to support and secure facility, water, electricity, internet, and other administrative necessities.
